## The Cottonwood Extension District in partnership with K-State Research and **About This Role:** Extension Local Food Systems is seeking a Local Food Fellow to complete the local food system project: Harvest Hays & FHSU Green Connections. The project aims to support the Fort Hays State University Department of Agriculture in developing and launching a hands-on Farm to Plate Camp. This camp will engage youth in agricultural education, teaching them sustainable gardening practices, plant science, and food production skills through interactive workshops and activities. Additionally, the project will assist Harvest Hays, a high tunnel garden operated by Arc of Central Plains, by creating and implementing effective marketing strategies to promote their locally grown produce, increasing community awareness and support for the garden's mission. This collaborative effort will enhance educational opportunities and strengthen community connections to local agriculture. This part-time, 20-week fellowship will run from March 31 through August 15, 2025 (approximately 16 hours per week). **Responsibilities:** The responsibilities of the person leading this project would include: Program Development: Collaborate with the Fort Hays State University • Department of Agriculture to coordinate curriculum and structure for the Farm to Plate Camp, which includes both produce gardening and animal agriculture, ensuring engaging and educational experiences for youth participants. Program Coordination: Organize logistics for Farm to Plate, including • scheduling sessions, coordinating instructors, preparing materials, and overseeing activities. Marketing Strategy: Work with Harvest Hays to develop a comprehensive marketing plan for their produce, using platforms like social media, community events, and local partnerships to reach potential customers. Collaborate with local farmer's markets to increase visibility and sales opportunities for Harvest Hays' produce. Community Engagement: Build relationships with community • stakeholders, such as local schools, youth organizations, and volunteers, to promote participation in both Farm to Plate and Harvest Hays' produce offerinas. Resource Management: Identify and secure resources including gardening supplies or educational tools to support both the program and the marketing initiatives. Evaluation and Reporting: Collect feedback from program participants and community members to assess the impact of the project, making improvements as needed and providing reports to stakeholders on outcomes. Outreach and Education: Provide workshops or educational sessions to support the marketing efforts and enhance community understanding of the benefits of locally grown produce. Complete final report to be submitted to K-State Research and Extension Local Food Systems Program Coordinator before finishing fellowship.
