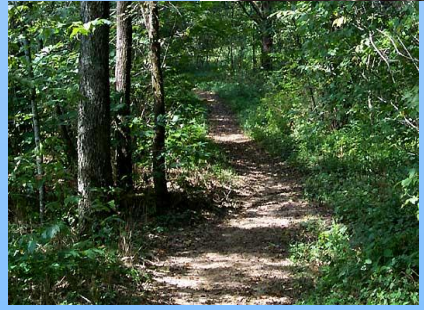
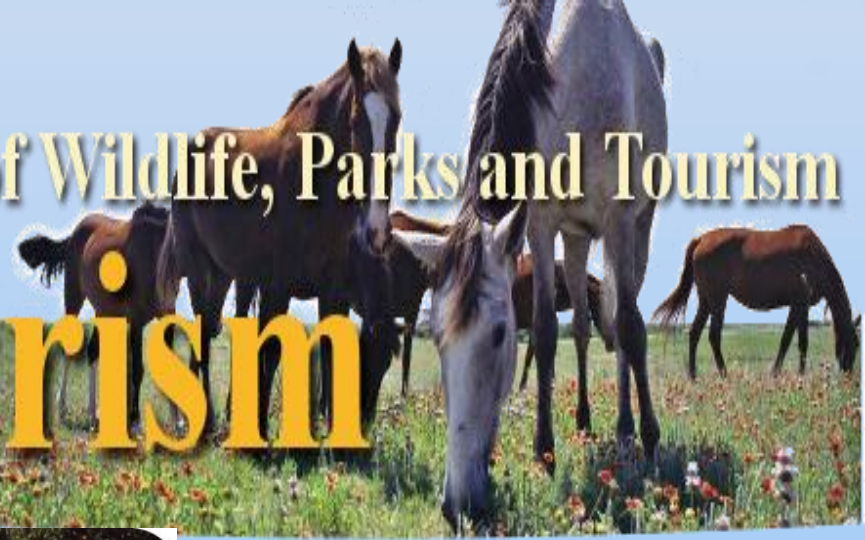

On average, overnight travelers spent \$347 in Kansas during their trip.

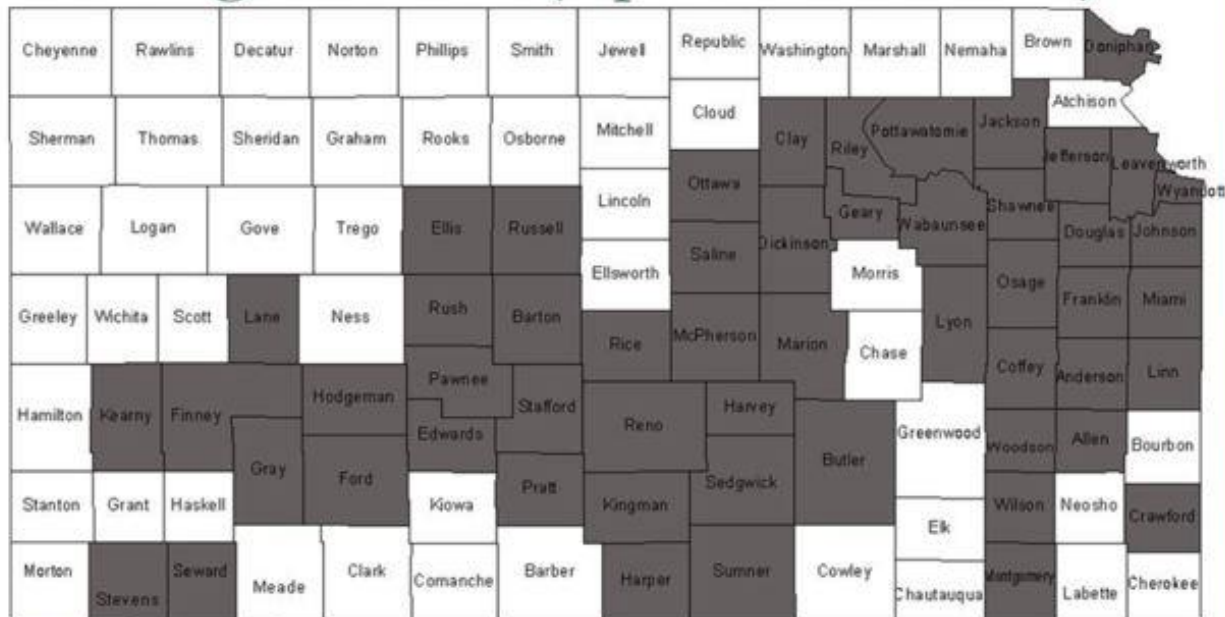
